<p>The CDC has not received any reports of pets or other animals becoming sick with COVID-19. It's important for your animal to be inside the home they know and love. If you get ill but are still able to care for your pet, it's best to keep them at home.</p>	<p>Are there other people in your home who can help? Do you have any friends, neighbours, or other family members that could take them in? You could also ask if there are any groomers, daycares, or boarding places that could help with advance notice.</p>	<p>It may seem like overkill but it will be very helpful should you find yourself in an emergency situation without the ability to get the proper supplies at a moment's notice. Your pet supply kit should include the following, to the best of your ability.</p>
